

DINOSAURS

ART

FOSSIL PRINTS

Make handprints in damp sand, fill with plaster of paris. Let dry. Remove plaster and rinse. Alternative: draw bones in sand and fill in. Make fossils.

DINOSAUR EGGS

Mix flour and water to form thin paste. Dip strips of newspaper in mixture and wrap wet strips around inflated balloon. Wrap several layers. Let dry. Paint dinosaur eggs.

DINOSAUR HATS



Material: Construction paper
Googly eyes
Scissors
Stapler
Ruler
Tape or glue
Markers

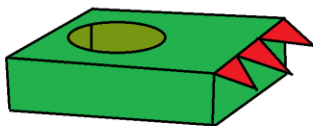
1. Cut out four 4-inch-long rectangular legs with pointed feet, an 11-inch-long tail that measures 4 inches across the top and tapers to a point, and a 9-inch-long head and attached neck that resembles a giant finger.
2. Cut out a 5-by-28-inch brow band, fit around child's head, and staple together the overlapping edges.
3. Have the kids tape or glue the legs and tail to the brow band.
4. Use the edge of a ruler to curl the top of the dinosaur's neck so that the face points downward.
5. Glue on googly eyes and draw on nostrils and a mouth.
6. Tape or glue the base of the neck to the inner brow band.

DINOSAUR PRINTS

Cut sponges into dino-shaped footprints. Dip in paint and print on paper. Or dip in water and stamp on cement walk.

DINOSAUR FEET

Material: Shoe box size boxes, paint, fun foam, glue gun, knife, newspaper, and duck tape.



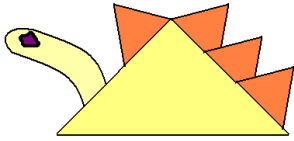
1. Cut a small hole in one end of each box just big enough for a child's foot to fit in.
2. Tape the box closed. Stuff the inside front and sides of the box with newspaper so child's foot will fit inside.
3. Paint the boxes a dinosaur color and let them dry.
4. Cut out claws from fun foam and glue them to the front top of the box.

DINOSAUR SKIN

Use faux crocodile or snakeskin items (like purses) to make rubbings. Or press items into clay to print reptile skin.

SNACK

STEGOSAURUS SANDWICH



Cut sandwich in half diagonally. Set each sandwich on plate long side on bottom. Arrange triangular tortilla chips along two short sides of sandwich. Place a banana half on one side for the dinosaur's neck and head. Add a raisin for an eye.

DIPLODOCUS TREAT

Color some Ranch dressing with green food coloring. Cut up some fresh broccoli. Pretend you are a diplodocus munching on treetops as you dip the broccoli into the dip.

DINOSAUR DIG DESSERT

8 scoops of chocolate ice cream
4 chocolate brownies, cut in half horizontally
8 Oreo cookies, crumbled (put in bag and crush)
Assorted gummi candies, especially gummi dinosaurs, gummi worms, and so on

Let chocolate ice cream soften slightly at room temperature (about 10 minutes)
Place 1/2 brownie at the bottom of each of four dessert bowls.
Spoon one scoop of softened ice cream over each brownie. Spread ice cream evenly, using the back of a metal spoon dipped in warm tap water.
Sprinkle gummi animals over the ice cream layer. Press them firmly into the ice cream.
Place second 1/2 of brownie on top of the gummi animals.
Spread another layer of ice cream over brownie.
Sprinkle ice cream with crushed Oreos
Place desserts in freezer until ice cream has set again (about 20 minutes)
Use your spoon to dig deep. Eat your way through Oreo dirt and layers of brownie rock to unearth dinosaur fossils!

OTHER FUN STUFF

DIGGING FOR DINOSAURS

Fill a large box with plastic dinosaur toys and packing foam. Let children "dig" up the dinosaurs. Alt: Hide small plastic dinosaurs in the sand table. Provide children with spoons and small brushes and encourage them to be archeologists.

DINOSAUR CAVE

Cover a card table with a blanket and let children pretend to be "cavemen." Add potted plants for decoration.

BRONTOSAURUS BOUNCE

Recite verse - "There's a brontosaurus down at the zoo. I'm going for a ride. You come too."

On word YOU, invite a child by pointing, to join you. Have child get behind you and place his hands on your hips. Then recite the following while bending and straightening knees and bouncing around the room.

"Bumpin' along on a dinosaur. Let's move over for just one more."
Stop bouncing and repeat until all children are part of the line.

DINOSAUR STOMP

Use rhythm instruments to make loud stomping sounds. Let children pretend to be dinosaurs and stomp to music.

FINGERPLAYS

MIGHTY DINOSAUR

Starting position: with left arm bent upright at elbow, hold left hand up with palm facing body and left thumb (the head) extended. Right hand - with palm facing body, place back of right hand against left hand palm. Position right hand slightly lower than left so that when the right thumb is extended (the tail) it is lower than the left thumb.

Here is a dinosaur, With tail and neck so long. (wiggle both thumbs)
This dinosaur is mighty and strong (hands together, move arms up and down)
All day she eats, plants of green (tilt arms to left, wiggle left thumb)
She's the biggest dinosaur you've ever seen! (raise arms over head)

QUIET DINOSAURS

DINOSAUR HUNT

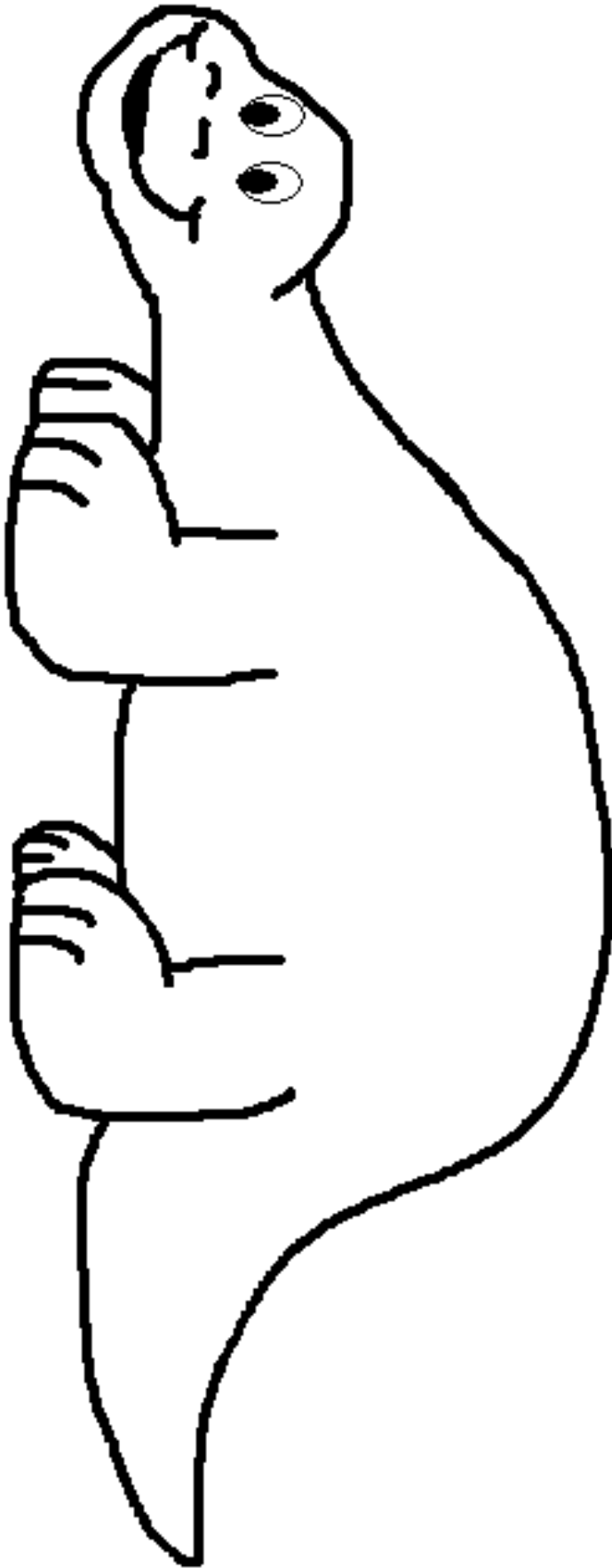
Going on a dinosaur hunt. (slap thighs)

Cut several dinos from different colors of poster board.

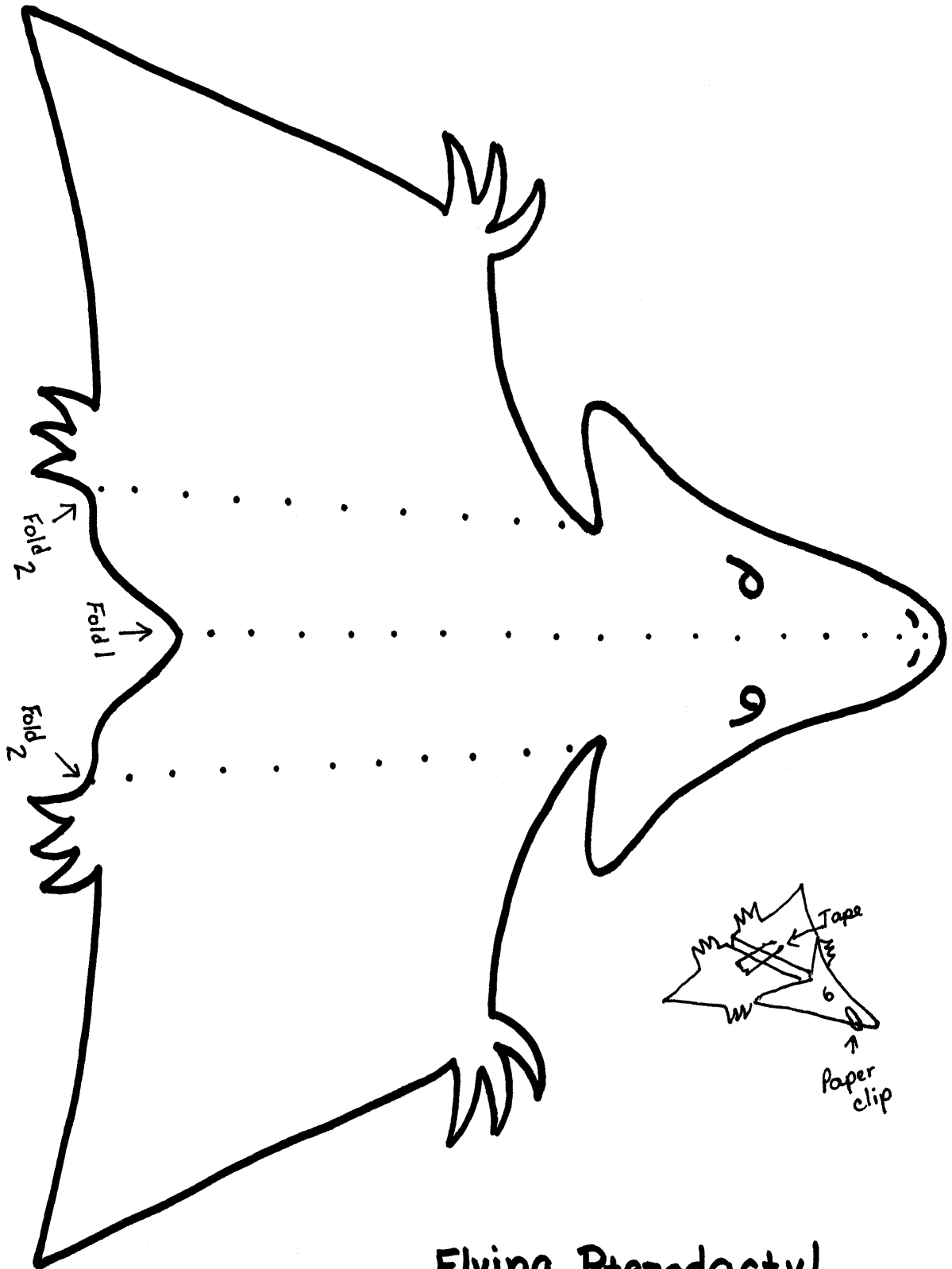
Purchase bag of colorful plastic clothespins. Label dinos with color word.

FLYING PTERODACTYL

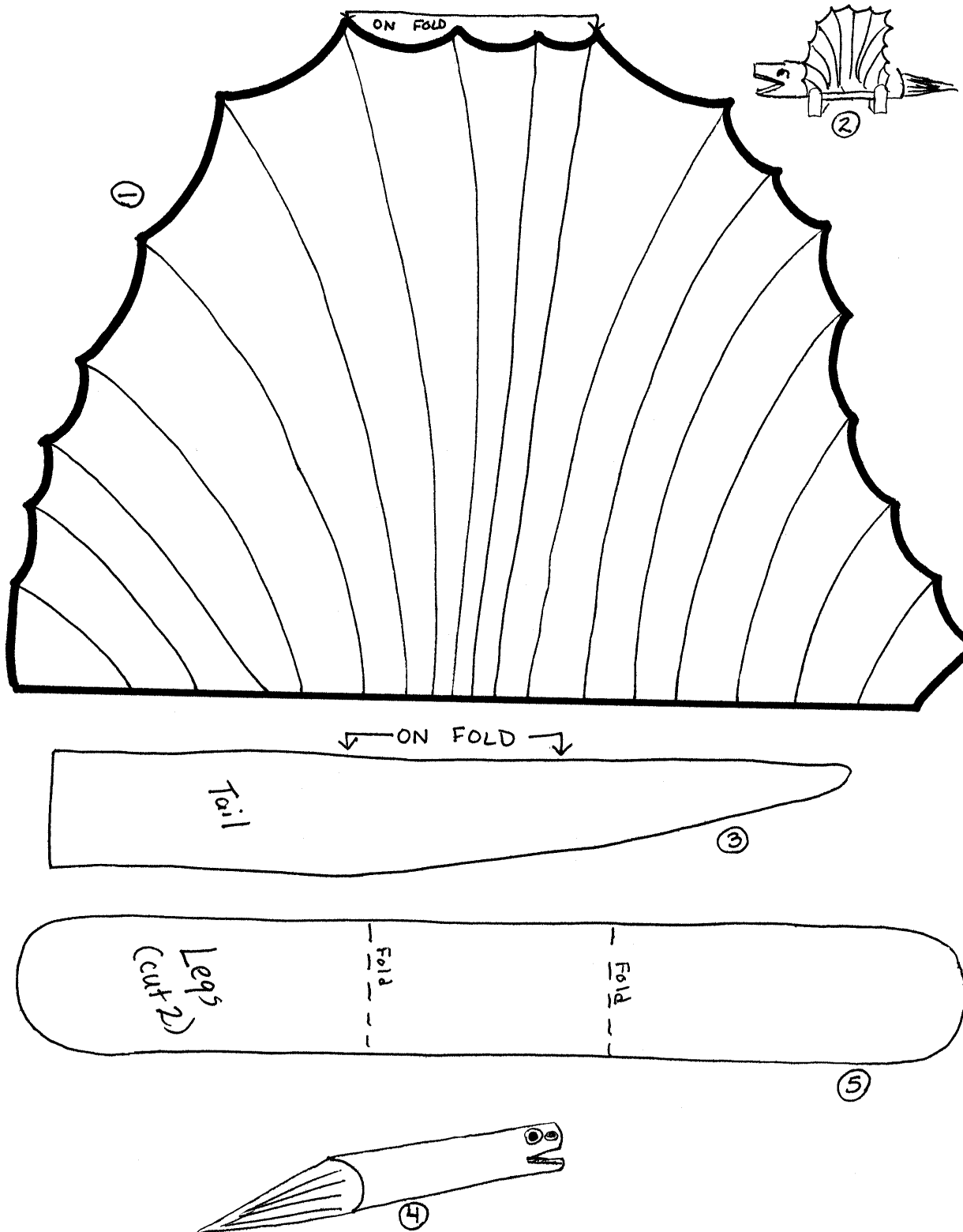
Let children color dinosaurs. Cut and fold pattern. Tape wings so they stick out. Add a paper clip to nose to provide balance.

DIMETRODON

1. Cover paper towel tube with 9 x 11 inch rectangle of construction paper.
2. Copy pattern 1 and cut for fin. Use marker to draw spines..
3. Glue the fin on each side of the body. (fig 2) Cut out a triangle mouth.
4. For tail, use pattern in fig. 3. Glue it inside the cylinder body, on the top side. Glue the tip of the tail together. (fig 4)
5. To make legs, copy pattern in fig. 5. Trace two legs onto poster board. Cut them out. Fold them up on the dotted lines. Use light-colored markers to color the legs on both sides. Use a black marker to draw feet and claws.
