### Suspect Arrested Hours After A Robbery and an Attempted Robbery

ABILENE, TX – 31 year old Jeremy Fuller was taken into custody just before 2 p.m. by Abilene Police Officers and the Street Crimes Unit for attempting to rob a north Abilene store and robbing another, just hours apart.

On Wednesday, August 16, 2017, at approximately 10:42 a.m., Dispatch received a call of a robbery at a store located on the 3300 Block of N. 10<sup>th</sup> St. The clerk said a male entered the store and asked them to come closer to him. The suspect displayed a knife and demanded money. The clerk ran out of the store with the suspect following. The suspect eventually left the area. No money was reported taken.

At approximately 12:25 p.m. a clerk from a convenience store located on the 2100 Block of S. 20<sup>th</sup> Street called Dispatch saying the store was just robbed. The suspect, described as a male and similar height and weight as the first attempted robbery, displayed a knife and demanded money from the clerk. The suspect fled the store with an undisclosed amount of money and cigarettes.

Through the investigation, officers saw a potential suspect vehicle parked at a home in a northeast Abilene neighborhood. The suspect was eventually captured after leaving the area and evading in his vehicle. Fuller is charged with 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Attempted Aggravated Robbery, 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Felony Aggravated Robbery and 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Evading Arrest Enhanced, due to prior convictions. He is being held at the Taylor County Jail in lieu of bonds totaling \$85,000.
